Census 2020 Action Plan Update

United States[®] Census APRIL 2020

When it comes to the United States Census, 72% of Californians belong to groups that have historically been undercounted. Additionally, Los Angeles County is the number one hardest-to-count county in the State. California's future strength in Congress depends on ensuring that all of us in our great State are counted.

LA Unified's Division of Adult and Career Education (DACE) is well positioned to reach hard-to-count populations throughout the Los Angeles region. DACE covers roughly 710 squares miles and serves nearly 70,000 students. This is why DACE teachers, administrators and staff play such a pivotal role in ensuring an accurate Census count. Whether it be for lack of understanding the importance of participating or out of fear, if Californians are not counted the state could lose multiple seats in Congress. All Californians must be counted in order to retain, and gain additional, access to money which supports new roads, schools and health care programs as well as services for children and seniors.

The US Census Bureau recognizes that with Census 2020, which relies heavily on online participation, those without reliable Internet connections may not get counted. The Census Action Kiosks being strategically placed at DACE schools will provide a reliable and welcoming environment for students and their families to complete the Census online.



Timeline

- » Provide professional development on Census materials to teachers
- » Sell Census t-shirts for Skills USA
- » Invite VIPs to visit school Census Actions Kiosks in April

February/March

Increase confidence and knowledge of Census

- » Announce Census Video student winners
- » Embed Census curricular activities into classroom instruction for all programs
- » Display Census pop-ups & activate Census Action Kiosks

April/May

Census Participation

- » Classes visit Census Action Kiosks to participate
- » Photograph students & VIPs at Census Action Kiosks and share on social media



So, going forward we will be introducing a series of Quick Links. What is a Quick Link? It is a short and easy-to-remember web address, or Uniform Resource Locator (URL), created to make it easier to get to the resources on our website that you use most.

Still confused? Let me give you an example. Let's say you wanted to view the DACE 2019-2020 Professional Development Plan on our website. Usually, from a web browser, you would take the following steps:

- Visit wearedace.org
- From the main navigation bar click on **Faculty & Staff**
- From the Faculty & Staff drop-down

menu click **Instructional Resources**

- From the sub-navigation menu, on the right of the page body, click **Professional Development**

That's quite a few steps. Of course, once there you might look at your web browser's address bar and notice that the actual web address for that page is:

www.wearedace.org/apps/pages/profDev

Yikes! Doesn't exactly roll off the tongue, does it? Yet, typing that into virtually any web browser address bar will take you directly to the Professional Development web page. Sure, you could bookmark it, but that won't help you if you are away from your device.
